SAFETY IN PLAY GROUND - 03/07/2017

Teaching kids how to play safely is important. If they know the rules of the playground, they're less likely to get hurt. Safe playground equipment and adult supervision are extremely important, but it's only half of the equation: Kids must know how to be safe and act responsibly at the playground. As the theme of the Month- July is SAFEGUARDING AND PROTECTION, the students were oriented on playground safety on 3rd July 17.

The Health and Safety Coordinator Ms Priyanka Rani along with the EduSports teacher Mr Amit Panwar took up an interactive session with students and teachers on how to be safe and act responsibly on the playground. Students were guided with the help of a presentation and demonstration on the safety rules to be followed before, after and while playing on the playground and while using the play equipments.

TMPIS also spreads the message to all the parents that whether the kids play at home or public playground, it's important for you to take a general look at the equipment to make sure that it is clean and well maintained and safe for the kids to play. It's also essential to have adult supervision to ensure that they are safeguarded at all times.

ORIENTATION OF STUDENTS AND STAFF ON SAFEGUARDING AND PROTECTION - 05/07/2017

Safeguarding is the action that is taken to promote the welfare of children and protect them from harm. Protecting children from abuse and maltreatment, preventing harm to children's health or development and ensuring children grow up with the provision of safe and effective care is important. The students and staff were oriented about "Safeguarding and Protection" on 5 July 17.

The Safeguarding Officer Ms Saloni Desai along with the Safety Officer Ms Priyanka Rani took up an interactive session with students and teachers on the different aspects of safeguarding where the children were oriented on different types of abuses and how to overcome those abuses. Students and staff were also briefed on "How to respond and report about any incident that they observe around them".



ORIENTATION OF STUDENTS AND STAFF ON SAFE TOUCH AND UNSAFE TOUCH 17/07/2017

An awareness program on 'Safe Touch and Unsafe Touch' was conducted at TMPIS on 17th of July 2017. The Safeguarding Officer Ms. Saloni Desai and Health and Safety Coordinator Ms. Priyanka Rani conducted the program with an aim to bring awareness among the students about how to prevent and act in certain situations like saying 'No' when being touched or held uncomfortably, 'Go' to people in their Safe Circle (parents, teachers and SG Officer) - people who could help and protect them and 'TELL' if they witness or experience any unsafe situation without keeping any secret. Students were shown the movie 'KOMAL' on Safe Touch and Unsafe touch and were explained to respect their bodies and also others. The program concluded on a positive note and lots of learning as take away.

CLAY MODEL MAKING COMPETITION - 21/07/2017

TMPIS organized a clay model making competition on 21st July 17 Friday for Pre-Primary students in its premises. The little ones were all set to give their best sculpt by their cute tiny artistic hands.
